

# CARE INSTRUCTIONS

# SYNTHETIC FIBERS

1. Wipe with a soft damp cloth with mild soap or a liquid cleaner.

Do not use acetone, trichloroethylene, ammonia or other corrosive plastic cleaners. Avoid using ethyl alcohol, abrasive solvents, cleaning powders, steel wools or rough sponge cloths.

# **NATURAL FIBERS**

- 1. Wipe with a soft damp cloth. Do not use alcohol or other spot-removers.
- 2. For a deeper cleaning use a little non-abrasive liquid detergent and wipe in one direction. Never use acetone, trichloroethylene or ammonia.
- 3. Dry the surface well with a soft cloth.

### **OUTDOOR FABRICS**

We use Sunbrella, an outdoor grade fabric which is guaranteed to be extremely durable, UV-resistant and colorfast.

- 1. Brush off any loose dirt.
- 2. Prepare a cleaning solution of 2 ounces (1/4 cup) mild soap per gallon of lukewarm water (less than 100°F / 38°C).
- 3. Use a sponge or a soft bristle brush to clean.
- 4. Allow cleaning solution to soak into fabric
- 5. Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- 6. Allow fabric to air dry.

#### LINENS

Linen is a very durable fabric and can be machine-washed with the rest of you laundry. Washing is recommended because the more linen is washed, the softer, more absorbent and more luminous it becomes.

- 1. Machine-wash linens with like colors according to their care instructions.
- 2. Iron linen while it is still very damp. Starch can help prevent excess creasing.

#### **POLYESTER**

- 1. Machine-wash polyester using the permanent press cycle and war water wash.
- 2. Add fabric softer during the rinse cycle to give it a softer feel and reduce static electricity.
- 3. Dry polyester on low heat setting in the dryer.
- 4. Remove from dryer promptly and hang or fold neatly to avoid unwanted creases.
- 5. Typically, polyester does not require ironing. If necessary, use a warm iron.
